Sunday Themes



As April begins we've still got a couple of weeks in our "AMAZED" by Jesus, and those who meet him after the resurrection.

We're then going to spend a few weeks looking at the OT hero Joseph. At a time when we're doing some 'dreaming' as a church it feels good to be reflecting around how God moulded and shaped this young dreamer, and through the downs and the ups of life he knew the presence of God.



With the Easter story ringing fresh in our ears we're going to be using some new material called ALIVE, walking with Mary by Jesus' tomb, the friends on the road to Emmaus, doubting Thomas. Each encounter reveals how Jesus reaches out to people at their place of need.

Over the summer we will then be walking through the Sermon on the Mount, and this hugely inspiring yet challenging teaching about life in the kingdom of God.

There are many activities for children and youth across our life at Trinity. For Sunday gatherings most people start off at the 11am at Meole Brace Church, where Trinity Kids and Trinity Youth agerelated groups meet each week. On the second Sunday of each month at 11am is an all-ages celebration.

You can join us online for one service every week which you can find on Facebook, or a link off our website at www.trinitychurches.org.
We usually livestream the 11am service, though on the second Sunday of the month we usually livestream the 9am instead.

COMMUNION

Our usual service pattern is weekly communion at 9am, then monthly at other services. (1st Sunday of month at 6.30pm, third Sunday of month 11am and HTBV, and fourth Sunday of month at CTK).

There are also two midweek services of Holy Communion taking place, 10am on first Thursday of month Belle Vue, and 10am on third Thursday of month Meole Brace.

"Christ is risen" But now what? An invitation to pray:

'Come, Holy Spirit'

In a few weeks' time (Thursday 9th May) we celebrate the day when the risen Jesus withdrew his earthly presence. His followers felt alone, though they knew that Jesus had promised the Spirit so they prayed 'Come, Holy Spirit'. Could we do the same, for ten days? Jesus said that God would give the Spirit to those who ask (Luke 11:13) – let's ask!

For just those 10 days, could you find one (or a few) person(s) and work out a way to pray each day? How you meet and how you pray is up to you, but there will be resources to help:

- A **prayer room** will be set aside in the Trinity Centre, bookable during daytime hours. Prayer ideas provided.
- There will be a downloadable/printed **daily prayer** with suggestions for a short prayer time.
- There will be **facilitated (Zoom and in-person) prayer gatherings** on some days, focussing on areas of work and need in our world.
- Each evening on Zoom we will hold a short service of **Compline**.

The ten days ends on Sunday 19 May – Pentecost – when we will pray together the prayer we have been praying all along: **Come, Holy Spirit.**

Musicians Worship Evening

An evening for musicians, singers, and anyone else wanting to get involved in our musical life together. We'll be learning a couple of new songs together, digging into a bit of input on "why / how" of worship, and reflecting on some of the joys and struggles in our worship at Trinity. All are welcome, whether you're currently involved or not.

A Spring Walk

Join in with others for a 6 mile circular walk to Pulley, Bayston Hill, Sutton and back. We meet at 10am at "The Meet Place", the community space at the heart of the Meole Estate. You may want to bring refreshments for a coffee-stop at halfway, and at the end we're hoping to people will bring their own lunch back at the Meet Place.

Womens Brunch

A morning for Trinity Women to get together. We'll begin with an American breakfast and time to be with friends old and new. We'll then have some space to worship and pray, to get creative, and to enjoy being together. We start at 9.30am, and will finish by 11.45am. Ticket contribution £7 includes craft activity to take home.

Annual Meeting

Our APCM provides the opportunity to take stock of how we're doing. This year we'll hear an update from the "Dream Team" doing some work around values and vision, as well as reports from some of the areas of ministry and mission here. We'll get a chance to do some of the 'business' which goes on as well which resources our wider life at Trinity.

Joint Service on Pentecost Sunday

Our Summer Joint Service takes place on Sunday 19th May at 10.30am. This brings together the 9am and 11am at Meole Brace and CTK. We'll be finding different ways to celebrate God's work across the world, and some of the ways in which we can partner with that. It's Pentecost Sunday, so we'll also be finding ways to be praying for each other that - wherever we are - we would be full of the Holy Spirit and sent out by God in our daily lives.



CHILDREN AND YOUTH AT TRINITY

As part of our usual Sunday morning gatherings, Trinity Kids are taking our sessions outside into the church grounds once a month on the fourth Sunday.

We are thankful for an amazing team and for the beautiful gardens around the church. We are using this space to help us encounter God in a deeper way and to step into God's Big Story through wondering, and exploring sights, sounds and smells. So far this year we have explored the story of creation, we've wondered about birds and what Jesus had to say about them, and we've placed ourselves in the joyous celebrations of Palm Sunday.

We'd love to continue growing and developing this creative ministry so if you are an adult with any forest, fire-pit, or hot chocolate making skills to put to good use, do please get in touch. And kids, remember to bring a coat and suitable outdoor shoes on the fourth Sunday of every month!


