

CHILDREN AND YOUTH AT TRINITY

As part of my Preschool Worker role, I was keen to trial a new group which I've called Prayer Sensory.

My inspiration came largely from a lovely baby group I used to take Caleb to called Baby Sensory and a book called Using Christian Contemplative Practice with Children. The book explores ways to help children engage with prayer in meaningful and creative ways, for example, by using movement, our senses, art, and the outdoors. The book challenged me not to limit a child's ability to attain stillness (not necessarily physical) and intimacy with God, so I wanted to give some of the ideas a go!

I put together three sessions, the first of which we had in May, to run as an opportunity to experiment together with preschool children and their parents. The format involves a short welcome prayer using movement and a giant scrunchie – a handy tool for a Preschool Worker (google it if you're not sure what it is!); three short prayer activities, such as drawing in the sand, bubble prayers, or a simple prayer labyrinth; and a gentle worship song with calming lights to finish. My hope and prayer is that everyone – baby, toddler or adult – can engage with the activities in some way and experience more of God's love and presence. You'd be so welcome to join us – please sign up on the church website as numbers are limited. The next two sessions are: Friday 21st June and Monday 15th July.



Keep in touch?

- Receive the weekly email. If you don't receive this drop the office a line and we'll add you to the list. Normally coming out on Thursday or so it begins with a short reflection from one of the staff team, and includes details of what's coming up in our life at Trinity.
- 2. Don't forget <u>www.trinitychurches.org</u>. We try and keep the website up to date, and includes an events diary where you can book into events or find out what's coming up. Also there are children and youth pages, staff contacts, giving etc. Watch out for revamped Trinity Centre website in September.
- 3. Find us on Facebook "Trinity Churches' Shrewsbury", where we'll be posting pictures, news, Sunday service videos etc.
- 4. Give the Office a ring on 01743 362399, where you'll most likely find the phone answered by Shannon, Kevin, Helen, Jenny or one of the other team who will be able to help you.
- 5. Get your ChurchSuite login, which gives access to your personalised church record online, helps you manage details like rotas, events, giving etc. Contact the Church Office if you want us to enable this for you.
- 6. **Stay awake in church** when it comes to the "church family news", which might not be everyone's favourite part of the service but is part of trying to talk about what's important, and what's coming up.
